# Land Acknowledgement


The land on which Reelworld operates is the traditional territory of many Nations, including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishinaabe, and the Chippewa. Our office is located in Toronto, which falls under Treaty 13 with the Mississaugas of the Credit. These Sovereign Nations have inhabited, protected, and cared for this land since time immemorial. We humbly acknowledge this enduring truth and our responsibilities as guests on this territory.

Reelworld recognizes that European colonialism violently dispossessed many Indigenous Peoples of their ancestral lands and continues to erase and marginalize their histories, cultures and sovereignty. We are committed to learning from, with, and alongside Indigenous Peoples, and to working to dismantle white supremacy and settler colonialism in all spheres of cultural, social, political and economic life.

We invite our community to reflect on their relationships to this land, to Indigenous sovereignty, and to take meaningful action toward truth, justice, and reconciliation.





























#### What is Reelworld?

Reelworld was founded in 2000 by award-winning actress and producer Tonya Williams to advance opportunities for Black, Indigenous, Asian, South Asian, and People of Colour Canadians in the screen industries. Reelworld advocates for racial equity in Canadian content and production while providing professional development and access to creative career and leadership opportunities.

The acclaimed **Reelworld Film Festival+Summit** welcomes audiences annually to experience the best of Canadian cinema and connect with a diverse network of industry changemakers. To encourage growth and inclusion in the sector, the **Reelworld Screen Institute** supports the creative and career development of Indigenous and racialized professionals with year-round training programs. Through **Access Reelworld**—Canada's largest open directory of Indigenous and racialized crew and talent—and the **Reelworld Foundation**, a registered charity, Reelworld is leading systemic transformation and accountability toward a more equitable and vibrant industry.

For 25 years, Reelworld has fearlessly and boldly amplified the voices of Indigenous and racialized storytellers and changemakers. This milestone is a testament to its impact and sets the stage for a future where all stories matter and everyone has an equal chance to be seen and to thrive.

# Reelworld Film Festival+Summit

The **Reelworld Film Festival**, celebrating its 25th anniversary, is Canada's longest-running film festival dedicated to showcasing films by Black, Indigenous, Asian, South Asian, and People of Colour filmmakers. The festival features 100% Canadian content across various genres, including narrative and documentary films, short films, music videos, animation, and episodic series.

This year, the film festival will take place in a hybrid format. In-person events and screenings are scheduled for October 16 to 19, with digital events on October 20. All films will be available online from October 17 to 26, 2025, and geo-blocked to Ontario.

The **Reelworld Summit**, launched in 2023, takes place on October 14 and 15. It features panel discussions, fireside chats with award recipients, workshops, Face2Face pitch sessions, keynote speeches, and networking opportunities. These collective elements foster an environment for Canadian creatives, industry professionals, funders, and stakeholders to engage in important conversations about the current state of the Canadian screen industries.

### **Welcome Letter**



It would be impossible for me to be celebrating the 25th year of Reelworld and not be in a reflective mood. I think of the very first Reelworld Film Festival back in April 4-9, 2001, and the many milestones we've achieved since: the impact we've made to the Canadian filmmakers we've served, the over 2000 alumni who have gone through our training programs, and the hundreds of staff we've trained who continue to strengthen the wider sector, contributing to organizations across the industry.

I remember the lean years when I could barely pay for two part-time staff, and I am proud that Reelworld now employs 10 full-time year-round staff. From our first and only program, the Emerging 20 (E20), we have grown to 7 year round programs, our two day summit, our hiring database Access Reelworld and of course celebrating the 25th anniversary of our film festival.

Along the way we've seen the confidence of our filmmakers grow, and we've seen the industry step up to improve racial equity and access to our screen sector. The great momentum of the past five years may seem to have slowed, but true change takes time. Even if progress sometimes feels like two steps forward and one step back, we are still moving forward. Over the past fifty years we have moved forward many, many steps, and Reelworld has been instrumental in that progress. Let us remember that the challenges of our industry have only made us stronger. Whatever we face in the future years we will prevail.

My hopes and dreams for Reelworld have shifted over the years. Now my desire is that Reelworld lives on long after me, that it grows beyond my wildest dreams and becomes a lasting institution for future generations.

We are so grateful to our allies, our sponsors, our funders and our partners who have never stepped away from us, who continue to inspire and support us with both resources and expertise. Thanks to them and this year's amazing group of filmmakers, speakers and panelists, we are able to celebrate 25 years of incredible film and community.

With years of experience working on film and television sets, Mohamed went on to create Sheeko Sheeko, a Somali webbased talk show that gained widespread recognition and even featured on Vice's Huang's World. It won the Best Podcast at the 2017 Toronto Webfest. His short documentary Football is our Home, about a homeless

soccer team, earned him the Best Short Documentary Audience Choice Award, at the 2013 Canadian Sports Film Festival. In addition, Mohamed created the web series Ayan's World, a vibrant portrayal of Somali culture.

#### **FILM NOTES**

Mohamed Ahmed's vibrant debut remixes the classic Shakespearean tale of star-crossed lovers, relocating it to Toronto's Somali community.

Reelworld's **Market Ready** initiative, in partnership with Warner Bros. Discovery Access Canada, equips Reelworld alumni with the training and access needed to navigate major industry markets, including Prime Time, Cannes, Banff, TIFF, Content Canada, and Content London. These markets offer vital opportunities to pitch projects, establish industry connections, and enhance visibility.

Selected participants undergo a two-month intensive preparation program that covers pitching, sales, financing, marketing, and networking. All pitch materials are refined, and participants are coached to engage in high-level industry conversations confidently. Support for travel, accommodation, and passes may be available. The goal is to help participants advance their projects, build key industry relationships, and strengthen their long-term career trajectory.


