

REELWORLD FOUNDATION

Founded in January 2002, ReelWorld Foundation's mandate is to provide year-round education, networking, mentorship and apprenticeship programs, screenings, round-table discussions, lobbying, advocacy, awards, bursaries, scholarships and events to help open doors for racially and culturally diverse artists in the Canadian entertainment industry.

REELWORLD INDEPENDENT PRODUCERS GROUP (RWIPG)

This group of dedicated emerging producers has been compiled by ReelWorld to guide and support them in their efforts to becoming key producers in Canada. The goal of producers in RWIPG is to create markets at home and internationally. With the help of ReelWorld, these participants are privy to industry mentoring and internship programs sponsored by production companies, broadcasters, government agencies and distributors.

REELWORLD NATIONAL SCREENWRITING CONTEST

This year, ReelWorld launches a screenwriting contest to help foster Canada's thriving talent pool. Five-minute short scripts from across Canada will be submitted to the ReelWorld offices. RWIPG members will be given a number of scripts to read and provide coverage on. RWIPG will be responsible for judging the individual scripts and the finalists will be announced to the public. The finalists' scripts will be produced by the RWIPG members with the help of key professionals in the Canadian entertainment industry. The results will be presented at ReelWorld Film Festival 2004, with the intent to have them packaged and aired on a national broadcaster's network.

REELWORLD ENTERTAINMENT DIRECTORY (RWED)

Hosted on ReelWorld's website, ReelWorld Entertainment Directory (RWED) will be the only complete and comprehensive database in Canada of racially and culturally diverse professionals in all areas of the entertainment business. The database will be available nationally and internationally to anyone seeking diverse talent in the entertainment industry.

REELWORLD ONGOING TRAINING

ReelWorld industry seminars, mentoring initiatives and media literacy programs will demystify the process of creating successful productions, and assist visible minorities to fully engage the entertainment industry.

Workshops, special events, TV and multimedia productions will focus on timely topics and will include elements of career orientation to introduce participants to careers and creative positions in film, including and beyond the roles of writer, director, producer or actor.








PASSHOLDER INFORMATION

- · Keep passes in a safe place. If lost or stolen, they cannot be replaced.
- · Passholders must show passes at all times for entry.
- · All screenings will be seated on a first-come, first-served basis except for priority reserved seating (up to 10 minutes prior to screening) for VIP Patron passholders.
- · Passholders do not require tickets for entry to screenings.
- Passholders do require an actual ticket for entry to seminars, interviews and panels, which are obtainable at the cinema box office as of April 4. Passes must be shown to get tickets, limit one ticket per pass. Tickets must be shown with pass for entry.
- · Theatres are wheelchair accessible.



30 YEARS TO LIFE

A spirited and intelligent comedy, 30 YEARS TO LIFE follows a group of friends as each faces the emotional crisis that comes with turning 30. The film zestfully and truthfully brings to life a set of engaging and personable characters: an investment banker with a great portfolio, but few prospects for companionship; a stand-up comedian whose future in the biz is more than a little uncertain; a real-estate agent fighting a lifelong battle with weight; a marketing executive who fears that getting ahead is akin to growing old; and a young man in a long-term relationship who is being asked where it's headed.

Fuelled by a superb script, 30 YEARS TO LIFE is a savvy portrait of upper-class African-American Gen-Xers who confront the spectre of adulthood and grownup responsibilities of marriage, children and their careers with fear, trepidation and an urgent desire to escape.

Director Vanessa Middleton displays remarkable perceptiveness about both sexes and elicits hilarious, genuine and appealing performances from the fantastic cast, which includes Erika Alexander (TV's Living Single), Melissa De Sousa (MISS CONGENIALITY), Kadeem Hardison (THE SIXTH MAN), Tracy Morgan (TV's Saturday Night Live), Paula Jai Parker (WHY DO FOOLS FALL IN LOVE), Allen Payne (THE PERFECT STORM) and T.E. Russell (TV's City of Angels).

Nominated for the Grand Jury Prize at Sundance Film Festival in 2001, 30 YEARS TO LIFE prompts questions about hopes and dreams for everyone who has turned or is about to reach the big three-0.



VANESSA MIDDLETON honed her skills writing for TV's The Cosby Show, Saturday Night Live and The Apollo Comedy Hour. She is co-founder of Exodus Entertainment, a production/distribution company, created by a group of 25 to 40-year-olds who were tired of the movies they saw and decided to do something about it. 30 YEARS TO LIFE is her first feature.

90 MILES

The U.S. and Cuba are only 90 miles apart, yet a huge political, historical and economic separation exists between them. 90 MILES is a documentary about the deep wound Cubans and Cuban-Americans live with every day as a result of this divide.

In 1980, Juan Carlos Zaldívar was a 13-year-old Communist demonstrating against the thousands of people deserting Cuba in the Mariel boatlift. Within a week, he and his older sister were called on by their father to make a decision that would change their lives forever. Shortly after, they were on their way.

Arriving in the U.S. on an overcrowded boat, the Zaldívar family faced hardships that ate away at family bonds. Falling victim to depression, Juan's father pulled away from the family and suffered tremendous blows to his self-esteem. Eighteen years after his family's departure, Juan returns to his hometown in search of a key that will unlock his father's happiness.

Using news clips, home movies, family photographs and original footage, 90 MILES blends the stories of one family's saga with a well-balanced look at the conflicting emotions and ideologies that Cuba still evokes and sheds new light on the often oversimplified Cuban-American issue.

Winner of Best Documentary at the 2001 New York Latino Film Festival and official selection at the Chicago and Los Angeles Latin Film Festivals, 90 MILES puts a face to the politically charged topic of the Cuban-American experience.



JUAN CARLOS ZALDÍVAR completed his film studies at New York University. His thesis film, THE STORY OF THE ROSE, premiered at Sundance in 1997 and was awarded a grant from the Warner Bros. Film Production Fund. He currently produces TV's In The Life (PBS) and teaches courses at NYU's Undergraduate Film Program.



THE BLUE DINER LA FONDA AZUL

THE BLUE DINER is an award-winning film about food, memory, love, language and caskets. Set amidst the bustling energy of Boston's Latino neighbourhoods of Dudley Street and Upham's Corner, the film is a compelling story of the relationship between a Puerto Rican woman (Miriam Colón, ALL THE PRETTY HORSES) and her daughter, and the men who weave in and out of their lives. All her life, Elena's (Lisa Vidal, TV's Third Watch and The Division) first language has been Spanish. Suddenly in the middle of a fight with her mother over her not-so-ex-lover Tito (José Yenque, TRAFFIC, THE PRICE OF GLORY, TV's NYPD Blue), Elena mysteriously loses her ability to speak or understand Spanish - except for a haunting song her long-lost father sang to her as a child. This mysterious loss forces Elena, her mother and Tito to re-examine what they mean to each other and how they communicate, causing a roller-coaster of laughter and pain along the way.

Unlike many films about Latinos in America, THE BLUE DINER tells a story without the usual urban stereotypes. One of the few fully bilingual American independent films, THE BLUE DINER received Best Feature Film and Audience Award at New York International Latino Film Festival, Best Foreign Film and the Audience Award at Chicago Latino Film Festival, the Excellence Award at CineSol's Film Festival and Best Film at New England Film Festival. The film was an official selection at Mar del Plata Film Festival. Seattle International Film Festival, Maui Film Festival, New York International Latino Film Festival and Los Angeles Film Festival.



JAN EGLESON has been writing and directing films since 1980. In 1984, he completed the award-winning trilogy BILLY IN THE LOWLANDS, THE DARK END OF THE STREET and THE TENDER AGE, which focused on working-class teens in Boston. He's also directed a number of pilots and made-for-TV movies.



CARMEN:

CARMEN: A HIP HOPERA is Robert Townsend's MTV remake of George Bizet's 1875 opera Carmen. First aired on the American music station in 2001, the film has never been seen by Canadian audiences. Featuring a cast of hip-hop heavy-weights that includes L'il Bow Wow, Rah Digga, Mos Def and Wyclef Jean, the film brings Carmen into the present with passion, drama, love, murder, corruption and plenty of modern-day street smarts and sensibilities.

Transported out of 19th century Spain, the original setting, and dropped into present-day Philadelphia and Los Angeles, CARMEN: A HIP HOPERA portrays the tumultuous and doomed love affair between feisty vixen Carmen Brown (Beyoncé Knowles of Destiny's Child) and police officer Derrick Hill (Mekhi Phifer, CLOCKERS, SOULFOOD).

Engaged to a 'good woman' (Reagan Gomez-Preston, JERRY MAGUIRE), Hill's life is on course until, as fate would have it, struggling actress Carmen struts into his life. Carmen is arrested when she lands herself in a fight after cruising another woman's boyfriend. CHRISTMAS AT WAPOS BAY

CHRISTMAS AT WAPOS BAY begins a few days before Christmas, when three aboriginal children visit their Moshum (grandfather) at his trap line cabin to learn the traditional ways of hunting, fishing and trapping. When animals in the area become scarce, Moshum worries that Christmas may be cancelled if there is not enough food to feed the family.

When T-Bear, Talon and Raven overhear their Moshum's worries, they decide to save Christmas by trapping enough food by themselves. Journeying into the wilderness, the children set traps and snares, and do some ice fishing. But their adventure quickly turns treacherous as storm clouds roll in and they lose their way. Engulfed in the storm, the children fear the worst until their Moshum, who explains that they are still too young to survive alone, finds them. As the group struggles to return safely to the cabin, the children are forced to put their survival skills to the test when Moshum

collapses from ill health.

The children eventually make it home early Christmas morning having learned valuable lessons about surviving in the north. Their Moshum is viewed through very different eyes as he regains his strength.

The story of Moshum and his grandchildren is a lesson on sharing, honesty and trust, which also explores the fascinating world of aboriginal life. CHRISTMAS AT WAPOS BAY brings to life a tale that proves original stories mixed with classic stop-motion animation are thoroughly enjoyable.



DENNIS JACKSON's first animated short film, JOURNEY THROUGH FEAR, won the Aboriginal Peoples Television Network/Telefilm Canada award. He went on to produce and direct HEARTBEAT OF THE EARTH, an awarding-winning 13-part series. He is currently developing and producing documentaries and children's animation through Dark Thunder Productions.

When an overly conscientious General Manager, Ray Clouds on Fire (Tim Vahle), learns that the exclusive Worthington Travel Guide has dispatched an anonymous critic to assess his resort, he sets off on a seemingly impossible mission to whip the place into shape. From an overly horny handyman to an ardent vegetarian chef (Graham Greene, DANCES WITH WOLVES) who refuses to cook meat for the guest, Ray's problems are plentiful and hilarious.



CRAZY AS HELL

Shot in just 19 days, CRAZY AS HELL — the feature directorial debut of one of TV audiences' favourite emergency room doctors, Eriq La Salle (ER's Dr. Peter Benton), epitomizes the soulful spirit of great independent filmmaking. In the story based on novelist Jeremy Leven's Satan, Michael Beach (TRUE ROMANCE, SOULFOOD, WAITING TO EXHALE, TV's Third Watch) plays Dr. Ty Adams, a maverick psychiatrist whose unconventional, non-medical approach to treating patients has crowned him a king in some circles — and an egomaniac in others.

To improve his reputation, Ty agrees to take part in a 30-day documentary that examines the effects of psychiatry on mental illness and, conversely, the effects of mental illness on psychiatry. At this point, there's no way for him to know he's about to embark on the hell ride of his life. But that's exactly what ensues. When a newly admitted patient (Eriq La Salle) claiming to be Satan enters the picture, Ty's life is turned upside down. As the documentary crew settles in and begins filming, this mysterious stranger works his way into Ty's world, unraveling his life and pushing him into a battle that only one of them will survive.

Flanked by talents such as Ronny Cox (ROBOCOP I, MURDER AT 1600, BEVERLY HILLS COP) and John C. McGinley (ANY GIVEN SUNDAY, THREE TO TANGO, TV's Scrubs), La Salle turns his gamble of independent filmmaking into something more of a well-calculated risk.



ERIQ LA SALLE is best known for his role on the hit TV series ER, but he's no stranger to the director's chair. In 1996, he wowed audiences and critics with TV's Rebound, which he directed for HBO. La Salle also heads up Humble Journey Films, the production company he started in 1997.

WHY ARE YOU A TRAILBLAZER?

Filmmakers in my generation can explore a number of documentary styles. We've got a strong tradition to draw from and we're making films at a time where new, cheap technology is allowing us to think of filmmaking in entirely different ways. If you can think of it, you can shoot it. My interest is in blending a personal lyrical style with strong narrative.

HOW DO YOU ENVISION YOUR ROLE IN THE FUTURE OF THE INDUSTRY?

To make films that dissolve boundaries – films that combine elements of documentary, drama and experimental film.

DUMBARTON BRIDGE

John Shed (Tom Wright, MURDER AT 1600, TV's Seinfeld) is a war veteran who works on the salt ponds and avoids his dreams by living life in isolation. His only pleasures are listening to classic jazz and shooting skeets. This marginal though comfortable existence is threatened by long-repressed demons from his past, which begin

This feature-length documentary about internet startup Kozmo.com and its two dynamic cofounders, 28-year-old Korean-Americans Joseph Park and Yong Kang inspires capitalistic fantasies of almost cartoonish proportions. Director Wonsuk Chin's deft ability to personalize the meteoric growth of the internet business in the late 1990s serves as a gripping document of the times recording the fast-paced business deals that catapult Kozmo.com's offices from Park's living room to a New York City high-rise.

E-DREAMS follows Park, a natural born entrepreneur and unabashed self-promoter, and his more sedate business partner, Kang, as they turn one simple idea — online shopping for basic cornerstore goods with one-hour delivery — into a multi-million dollar company with subsidiaries operating in 11 American cities.

Following Park and his cronies from insider business deals, which result in major financing from powerhouse corporations like Starbucks and Amazon.com, to launch parties where everyone salivates over the potential money to be made from a public offering of the company, it's nearly impossible not to get caught up in the action and root for the company to succeed.

Set to a brilliant electronica score by acclaimed composer Woody Pak, Chin's forceful filmmaking personalizes the dot-com phenomenon by revealing how a company's impending wealth and fame affects employees and the founders.







A HUEY P. NEWTON STORY

A HUEY P. NEWTON STORY is an intimate portrait of the late co-founder of the Black Panther Party for Self Defense. Through the Black Panther organization, Newton helped shine a spotlight on aspects of the civil-rights movement and the revolution for African-Americans in a way very different from the disciples of Martin Luther King Jr. Newton embraced Malcolm X's call for freedom "by any means necessary" and identified with his rhetorical attacks against non-violent civil-rights leaders and white authority. Newton cared deeply about elevating the status, education and power of his black brothers and sisters, especially in the development and nurturing of the community's children. He was responsible for programs that clothed, fed and educated children, in 1989. Newton was gunned down in Oakland, California.

Adapted from Roger Guenveur Smith's Obie Award-winning off-Broadway solo performance of the same name, director Spike Lee brings the play to the screen as only he could, using his signature mixture of film and archival footage to capture Newton's inner mind. The film is complemented by a musical score of period material and original compositions from sound designer Marc Anthony Thompson who received an Obie and Audelco Award for his work and features actor/composer and Grammy Award winner Branford Marsalis.

The seventh film collaboration between Smith and Lee, A HUEY P. NEWTON STORY has received immense critical acclaim. It screened at Venice International Film Festival, BFM International Film Festival.



SPIKE LEE has established himself as one of Hollywood's most important and influential filmmakers. His debut film, SHE'S GOTTA HAVE IT, earned him the Prix de Jeunesse Award at Cannes Film Festival and set him at the forefront of Black New Wave in American cinema. Lee's most recent films include BAMBOOZLED, SUMMER OF SAM and GET ON THE BUS.

EUNHEE CHA was born in Korea and grew up in the Canadian town of Fort McMurray, Alberta. She attended Edmonton's University of Alberta and received degrees in both music and education. JOURNEY FOR LOTUS is her first film. It has toured festivals around the world.

RAISON D'ÊTRE:

I've traditionally been attracted to the styles of early 20th century silent film, for both its technical and visual innovation, but I am particularly fascinated by the timeless universality of the genre's narratives. I've also spent a great deal of time dealing with themes of repetition and alienation in my films. I feel these to be as relevant today as in any period of history.

WHY ARE YOU A TRAILBLAZER?

Having worked in the theatre, I developed a distinctive writing style, and these stylistic eccentricities were further developed in my work. For me, style and structure have always been as important as theme, and I would say, as of late, I am now finding fresh opportunities to expand upon them, and to explore new ways of reinterpreting the meanings behind them.

HOW DO YOU ENVISION YOUR ROLE IN THE FUTURE OF THE INDUSTRY?

I have produced all of my films outside of the industry. This has really strengthened my opinions about the collective process, and when applied to the industry, this process can produce startling results. I think it is important — which has more to do with who you hire than the role you hire them for.

KHALED chronicles the hard-knock life of Khaled (Michael D'Ascenzo, JULIE WALKING HOME, TV's Super Rupert), a 10-year-old boy of Moroccan heritage, whose increasingly harsh and alienating life experiences corner him in a state of arrested development and utter despair. From a young age, Khaled has been bounced from foster home to foster home because of his mother's (Michèle Duquet, THE VIRGIN SUICIDES, TV's Bliss) drug habit. Finally reunited, his relief overcomes the discomforts of their lack of money and the annoying barrage of unwelcome visitors - from their smarmy landlord to the probing social workers.

The unexpected death of Khaled's mother throws him back into dreaded chaos. Instead of notifying the authorities. Khaled strains to continue life normally as her body slowly but surely decomposes in the bedroom of their inner-city public housing unit. The pressures of keeping her death a secret mount as the building manager comes looking for rent, the social worker starts asking questions and the neighbours begin to notice a strange smell.

Winner of the International Critics' Award at Toronto International Film Festival 2001 and a special jury mention at 2001 Vancouver International Film Festival, KHALED comprises an exceptional cast of newcomers and seasoned professionals. Massombagi's insightful script and austere direction imbue this rugged tale with an unusual tenderness and formidable acknowledgment of the lengths to which one will go to hold onto love and maintain order and stability in an often cold world.



ASGHAR MASSOMBAGI was born and raised in Tehran, Iran. He immigrated to Canada in 1986. After honing his skill at Simon Fraser University, he graduated with a double major in film and computer science. His credits include two short films, FEEL LIKE CHICKEN TONIGHT and THE MIRACLE, KHALED is his first feature film.

I see my role as being a great storyteller to a worldwide audience with solid stories that make people laugh and cry. I also give young artists a forum for their expression with the annual International Teen Movie Festival and would like to continue to do that for many years to come.

TRANSPARENT SATORARE

Unique and highly entertaining, TRANSPARENT is equal parts spy/conspiracy, romance, drama and comedy told with grace and succinct urgency. Suffering from Dissociative Bulesis Transmission Disorder, a condition that allows private thoughts to be audible to anyone within a 10-metre radius, seven 'Transparents' are sequestered across Japan. 

RAMIRO **PUERTA TRIBUTE**



ReelWorld friend and programmer Ramiro Puerta passed away in the fall of 2001. To celebrate his wonderful life and accomplishments, the festival is screening several of his films. Close friend and colleague, Maclean's Brian D. Johnson, wrote this personal memorial. Ramiro will be deeply missed by all.

He worked as an actor, writer, director, singer, bandleader and film programmer. But most of all, wherever he worked, he played. Ramiro Puerta knew how to dance that elusive line between art and life. He was a human crossroads, an enthusiast with a passion for connecting cultures.

Born in Bogatà and educated in London, Ramiro made his home in Toronto, and the world his playground. As a programmer with the Toronto International Film Festival, he helped ignite the explosion of Spanish and Latin American cinema in North America. Ramiro also became our man in Havana: when an embargo prevented American festivals from obtaining Cuban films, he took delight in smuggling them into the U.S. under misleading labels.

As a director, Ramiro made a quartet of short films, ranging from CRUCERO/CROSSROADS, a satirical look at Latin-Canadian alienation, to TOPIC OF CANCER, a medical comedy of errors about his fight against colon cancer. But his most touching work is TWO FEET, ONE ANGEL, a 12-minute marvel of magic realism that offers a prescient glimpse of his own death - and transformation into a dapper, dancing angel.


For Ramiro, music and film were threaded with the same spirit. As

the leader of a14-piece Latin band, he thawed Toronto winters with the tropical rhythms of son, salsa and cumbia. And he must be the only programmer who has ever introduced a film (Fernando Trueba's jazz anthology, CALLE 54) by performing music onstage with one of its stars.






TRACKS IN THE SNOW

Gather the who's who of Canadian hip-hop artists and what you'll end up with is the complete works of one Michael P. Douglas.

To date, he has transformed the careers of local artists from being just that to artists of national prominence, utilizing the medium of music video and the venue that is MuchMusic.

From internationally signed Choclair, Kardinal Offishall, Jelleestone and the Rascalz to neighbourhood heroes IRS, Dan-e-o and Ghetto Concept, Douglas' realized visions have served to foster the growth of the perpetually burgeoning Canadian hip-hop scene.

His ability to create results that defy budgetary limitations is encouraging to both emerging projects and those financed by the multinationals. So critical is rotation on the 'nation's music station' to majors and independents alike given limited radio opportunities that the role of a Michael P. Douglas can only be seen as part of an artist's recipe for success.

MOVIN' ON UP

The Canadian urban music scene has had a most unique evolution. In most major markets, artists aspire to video exposure after having attained some level of prominence on radio. Prior to the introduction of FLOW 93.5, the Canadian market's underdeveloped radio scene resulted in more urban artists being introduced to the mainstream market through video and VideoFact sponsorship than through radio.

Born from this was the career of one Kevin De Freitas. De Freitas embarked on the scene with a VideoFact-funded project entitled Formation, featuring Mathematik – an artist perceived on the streets as the hip-hop purist.



Important to any career is the ability to discern who to associate oneself with and the benefits of doing so. De Freitas' career has been moving at a steady pace in one direction, largely resulting from his careful selection of which artists to work with — each representing a step in the right direction. Having worked with artists like Saukrates, Baby Blue Sound Crew, Kardinal Offishall and now Sol (his biggest budget and first international project), De Freitas is 'movin' on up'.

FEATURED ARTIST

The increasing popularity of hip hop can be attributed to the driving rhythmic message transmitted by repetitive drum patterns or the vast amount of concentrated words, metaphors and phrases used over the standard length of a song. Inarguable, however, is the importance of video in validating the credibility of an artist. The use of real and surreal imagery in projecting street credibility, wealth and sex appeal has proven paramount to shooting a film.

The image of a hip-hop artist must, above all, project credibility. The resulting reality is that 90 percent of urban artists in their efforts to accomplish this can be lumped into a pile along with their designer labels, dubs, furs and scantily clad women.

Toronto's Kardinal Offishall is an exception to the rule. He has made a name for himself by projecting his cultural reality and his ability to marry street slang with his own creative juices, resulting in what is now dubbed 'Bakardi Slang'. His unique approach to the choreographed dance routine in Husslin' and his omnipresence in the award-winning Northern Touch were no doubt instrumental in his since-successful quest to attain an international recording contract with Universal/MCA. Who else but Kardinal could comfortably assume the role of professor and offer 'Bakardi Slang' as a course in T-dot lingo 101?

Kardinal's original approach and honest representation of himself has afforded him the opportunity to collaborate with the likes of Beenie Man and Busta Rhymes, who seems to endorse Kardi's name on every possible occasion.

Video directors Michael Douglas and Kevin De Freitas consider their association with Kardinal to have been critical in the development of their careers.

De Freitas had a few words to say about his experiences with Kardinal. "He is an artist on the rise, doin' big things. Anytime you can be associated with an artist as creative and fearless as Kardi, it can only help you. His energy and good music are conducive to making great videos. He is always willing to approach things a little left of centre while staying aware of the little clichéd elements necessary for the marketing of an act."




