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

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

Frances-Anne Solomon's *A Winter Tale* is a disturbingly accurate and timely portrayal of the gun violence plaguing the black community in Toronto. To help deal with the emotional trauma, Gene, a social worker, struggles to get the men in the neighbourhood to talk about their feelings after a young boy is murdered by a bullet meant for a drug dealer.

In the downtown Toronto community of Parkdale, grief and suspicion hang heavily in the air. While the nightly patrons at Miss G's Caribbean TakeAway resume their ritual of beer and banter, six men make a pact to form a support group in hopes of salvaging their broken spirits and redeeming their besieged community. Anger, fear, and frustration permeate the community that has taken an unwritten code of silence.

A Winter Tale is set against the backdrop of a multicultural community's unrealized hopes and dreams. Bitter and tragic, funny and hopeful, the film tells a uniquely Canadian story that features Toronto as a central character.



Nagesh Kukunoor is a highly celebrated independent South Asian filmmaker. Credited for the birth of New Indian Cinema, Kukunoor defies tradition and is the most versatile director in India, the birthplace of Bollywood cinemas. With Dor he takes a 180-degree turn from his award-winning film, Igbal, which screened at ReelWorld in 2006. In Dor. two distinct women find themselves fighting to understand the details surrounding a tragic accident, which has led to the death of a loved one. It's complicated because the accident occurred in Saudi Arabia, where their husbands were both gainfully employed.

In typical Kukunoor fashion, the relationships are the centre point of this film. His fascination with why and how people are connected is prominent, and his eagerness to show how destiny has no real direction gives *Dor* a distinct feel.

Dor is wonderfully shot against picturesque locations in Himachal and Rajasthan, which are characters themselves in the film. The script is engaging and Kukunoor pulls out fantastic performances by Shreyas Talpade and Gul Panag. A stand out

performance by Ayesha Takia as Meera proves why critics are calling her one of India's most promising up-and-comers.

Nagesh Kukunoor was born in Hyderabad, India, and moved to Atlanta in 1988, where he studied chemical engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology. He was an environmental consultant in Atlanta before returning to India in 1997 to pursue a career in filmmaking. His credits include *Hyderabad Blues*, *Bollywood Calling* and *Iqbal*, which have all screened previously at ReelWorld.



A statement from director Chris Browne: "I had always wanted to do a documentary on Perry [Henzell] from the time I left film school in Chicago in 1982. I am happy it took me so long to get around to it, because over time I discovered how difficult it is to make a film, much less a feature film. And Perry did it in the early 70s – in Jamaica – when Jamaica barely had a TV station, much less a film industry. 



Brocket 99 is a highly controversial and arguably racist – yet undeniably popular – audiotape that parodies Canada's Aboriginal people. Made in 1984 by DJs in Lethbridge, Alberta, the tape was reportedly meant as a joke and never should have made it into the public forum. But somehow it did. It has since circulated around the world, gathering a large fan base along the way.

Nilesh Patel's documentary, *Brocket* 99 – *Rockin' the Country*, explores the phenomenon of this underground radio broadcast as well as the attitudes of people toward it and the issues raised by the "humour" presented within it. From B.C. to Southern Alberta and Saskatchewan, Patel shares a story that will open your eyes to a side of Canada that most people never see. Shot with a rugged, documentary feel, audiences will become engrossed in the journey Patel takes them on and won't want to stop until they learn everything.

Brocket 99 – Rockin' the Country has screened at festivals across North America. It was short listed for awards at the 2006 Calgary International Film Festival and the Edmonton International Film Festival, and won the Sequences First Prize for a Documentary at the First Peoples' Festival of Montreal. It's recommended for anyone who has a genuine interest in learning more about this often forgotten part of Canadian history.



The village has been disrupted by construction of the wall separating Israel from the West Bank. The Amers home is now separated from their plantation by a checkpoint and their lives are dominated by electrified fences, locks and a constant swarm of armed soldiers. Every day, the head of the family, Hani, waits patiently for soldiers to unlock the gate and allow him to go to work and the children to go to school. As their dramas unfold, it provides glimpses into their constant struggles and the small, endearing details that sustain them: school friends, olive trees and two small donkeys.

In this age of media propaganda, Mexican-born filmmaker Carolina Rivas succeeds in depicting Palestinians as human beings who want peace and justice like everybody else. The film is a contemplative outcry, photographed in natural light, which attests to human dignity with a great open heart. Ten years ago, the provincial government in Ontario lowered welfare rates by about 20 percent. Today the 760,000 Ontario residents who rely on this financial assistance can't make ends meet – and yet the province refuses to address the issue in any meaningful way.

Director Charles Kassatly's Finding My Way is a powerful feature-length documentary that cracks open the shrouded disconnect around poverty and homelessness in Toronto. It focuses on the Anishnawbe Mission and Health Centre, a grassroots Native organization that actively fights homelessness in Toronto through its street patrol vans and outreach programs.

Finding My Way invites audiences into the lives of three individuals who overcame addiction and street life thanks to the Anishnawbe Mission. Not only does it underline the importance of such organizations, but it also adds humanity to the thousands of homeless Aboriginal faces desperately struggling to survive. The documentary deals with their destitution, faith and hope as it shows the dysfunction permeating social programs across Canada, especially in the Greater Toronto Area. It also focuses

on the legislation that would get the homeless off the streets by providing them with affordable housing.

Finding My Way serves as a deafening plea for help. It highlights the issues surrounding homelessness and demands an immediate long-term solution.





Directors Nadia Zouaoui and Carmen Garcia's documentary, *Le Voyage de Nadia*, explores this inequality through the experiences of one woman who decides to return to her homeland, Algeria, after living "freely" in Montreal for 15 years.

This courageous documentary exposes the obscurantism that still exists at the dawn of the 21st century in Algeria. It recounts how women are treated and illustrates the cruelty of customs dictating the status of women in family and society. For women, surrounded by oppressive walls and severe traditions, freedom is a figment of the imagination. A strong sense of family honour and fear of disgrace dictate their fragile existence.

Fascinating individuals explain how these strict rules are imposed, divesting girls and women of the right to move about freely or speak out, and even depriving them of the desire to defend their rights and liberties. The underlying patriarchal violence inherent to the situation is

evident – a violence that is often misused in the name of the Muslim religion and respect for traditions.

Le Voyage de Nadia is a unique and revealing examination of the weight of tradition, generational sacrifice and denial of equality – a cry of revolt imbued with surprising sensitivity and poetry.

In director Ngozi Onwurah's powerful must-see drama, Shoot the Messenger, Joe, a successful black man with a highpaying software job, decides to leave his prosperous career to become a teacher at an urban high school. It is his hope to be seen as a positive role model. However, after being falsely accused of assault by one of his students, the black community quickly turns against him, and a court case ensues. After being found guilty, a disgraced Joe loses everything.

Shoot the Messenger is a timely film that introduces the audience to racism from an unexpected perspective. The film mercilessly confronts the issues currently plaguing the black community in an honest voice. Onruwah takes the viewer on a mesmerizing exploration of inner beliefs and attitudes about blacks from the perspective of an unlikely source: other blacks. Not always easy to watch, it is a brutally aggressive depiction of racism and stereotyping that leaves the viewer achingly exposed yet hopeful that there's light at the end of the tunnel.

Shoot the Messenger has screened to critical acclaim at festivals around the world, and won the Jury Favorite

Award at the 2007 Pan African Film Festival. It stops at ReelWorld for its Canadian premiere.

Similar to a theatrical play, with a story that unfolds in one day, one location and with few actors, *Skin Deep* is a brilliant suspense story by Sacha Parisot. Anthony, a successful Haitian engineer appears to have it all: a good career, an amazing house, a beautiful wife. But even with all this success something is missing: a fulfilling sex life. Anthony would prefer to improve things with his wife, Victoria, but instead he finds a mistress who will do anything to make him leave his wife.

On this particular day, Anthony and Victoria have their friends, Michael and Sarah, over for a relaxing afternoon. A mild tension hangs in the air since Michael has never accepted Anthony's preference for white women. The tension escalates when Sarah is found dead in the hot tub, and of course, there are no witnesses.

In a film where betrayal, discrimination, bribes, sex and love collide, *Skin Deep* is an intriguing and well-structured story that will keep you on the edge of your seat. The actors are striking, and the production quality, for a low-budget feature, is impressive.

Facing an eviction notice, Murphy, a fortune cookie writer and his echoboomer roommates confront the usual questions of sex, love and identity that face any generation coming of age. But this familiar story takes a different turn when Murphy's stoner-biochemist roommate manufactures homemade ecstasy to pay off his overdue rent, and Murphy mistakes the pills for his allergy medicine. As old friends start to drift apart, he gradually finds himself drawn to a strange new muse intent on shaking up his life. The Achievers is a visual mash-up that will keep the audience engrossed in its cleverly intertwined plotlines and lively soundtrack.

Lim's original screenplay for *The Achievers* was one of the top 50 finalists for HBO's Project Greenlight, a unique reality show conceived by Oscar-winning writers/actors Ben Affleck and Matt Damon, along with producer Chris Moore. In 2005, it was awarded a production grant from the National Asian American Theatre Association



She does not approve of Vikram's Caucasian girlfriend, Lillian, and would prefer that he marry a Punjabi girl, but Vikram has made up his mind. Then the lives of all Californians are turned upside down when eight people die after drinking contaminated tap water. The State goes on alert, with the police working to ensure the culprits are caught. But the locals have to obey the instructions: no contact with tap water for 72 hours. This means no washing, no showering, no shaving and no drinking from the tap – daily routines that most of us take for granted.

Waterborne weaves intertwining

The film vividly challenges audiences to consider the danger of a water crisis, and the direct impact it would have on those who rely on this resource. What follows is a cleverly articulated story that is both gripping and thought provoking. The best thing is that it sparks the types

of conversations that a filmmaker can only hope will change the way we use the resources around us.







CAMERON BAILEY: WINNER OF THE TONY STOLTZ REELWORLD VISIONARY AWARD



TONY STOLTZ



CAMERON BAILEY

One year after his passing in 2002, ReelWorld paid tribute to its own unsung hero Tony Stoltz by creating the Tony Stoltz Completion Fund Award for a Canadian producer. This was made possible through the generous support of his wife, writer/ producer, Lynne Stoltz, now a ReelWorld Film Festival board member, and his daughter, Sasha Stoltz-Guy. The award was a fitting dedication to a man who displayed expert knowledge of and passion for two things – business and Canadian film.

Tony's first project produced under Have Faith Productions, Loud Silence, garnered attention from three of North America's most talented and revered artists – Mykelti Williamson, Alfre Woodard and Dr. Maya Angelou. The film was adapted from the novel written by his "forever soul mate" Lynne. He handled it all with standards and integrity, never losing sight of what mattered most to him, his family and his friends.

Tony believed in the Canadian film industry and had great expectations of it. He joined the ReelWorld Foundation board to help bring its vision to life. Gone too soon? Yes, but not forgotten. It is in this spirit that ReelWorld is honoured, along with his family, to introduce a new award in Tony's memory – the Tony Stoltz ReelWorld Visionary Award. The award applauds an individual who is not afraid to pioneer and create opportunities for others, to open closed doors to make change happen. Tony was such an individual. Thank you Tony for the man you were and the man we still remember. We miss you.

This year's inaugural recipient is none other than Cameron Bailey.

Cameron Bailey is a writer, broadcaster and film programmer in Toronto. He reviews film for Toronto's Now magazine and CBC Radio One, and for many years reviewed for the CTV network's breakfast television show Canada AM. He presented international cinema nightly on Showcase Television's The Showcase Revue, and also produced and hosted the interview show Filmmaker on the Independent Film Channel Canada. In the U.S., he has co-hosted *In The Can* for the Sundance Channel/PCTV.


Bailey is an international programmer for the Toronto International Film Festival. He founded the festival's Planet Africa section, and headed its Perspective Canada series. He now programs films from Africa, South Asia, the Philippines, the U.S. and Europe.

Born in London, England, and raised in Barbados and Toronto, he graduated from the University of Western Ontario with an Honours Degree in English literature. He pursued graduate study in Film at York University.

Bailey has contributed articles on subjects including cinema, Black culture and new technology to numerous publications and has been a guest speaker at several Canadian universities, as well as the Smithsonian Institution, Harvard University, New York University and the Banff Centre For the Arts.

In 1997 Bailey completed his first screenplay, The Planet of Junior Brown, co-written with director Clement Virgo. The film was named Best Picture at the 1998 Urbanworld Film Festival in New York, and was nominated for a Best Screenplay Gemini Award. He also has completed a video essay shot in Brazil, Hotel Saudade, which premiered at the 2004 Toronto International Film Festival, and won the Best Canadian Film prize at Montreal's Vues D'Afrique Festival. It made its U.S. premiere in 2005 at New York's Museum of Modern Art.

AWAOVIEYI AGIE

OCCUPATION: ACTOR

BORN: PORT HARCOURT, NIGERIA **LIVES:** LOS ANGELES/TORONTO

"I feel that I have a unique perspective. I am an African man raised in Canada who has been heavily exposed to and influenced by American and Caribbean culture."

WHAT ARE YOU CURRENTLY WORKING ON?

I recently completed the first draft of a screenplay called *Diner*?, which I cowrote with Richard Leacock and Michael Anthony Rawlins. I'm also writing a screenplay inspired by my visit to Nigeria and Ghana after a 15-year absence.

WHAT PAST PROJECT ARE YOU MOST PROUD OF?

I am most proud of *Red Deer*, *Tears* of the Sun and Vision TV's pilot, *Hotel Babylon*. Red Deer was my first lead role in a feature film. It won Best First Feature at the Toronto International Film Festival and the Victoria Film Festival. I am equally proud of *Tears of the Sun*, for it attempted to shed light on the ongoing genocide and oil conflict in Africa. I am proud of *Hotel Babylon* because it shows cultural diversity.

WHAT IS YOUR RAISON D'ÊTRE?

I enjoy the process of creating. Whether I'm acting, writing, sculpting or painting, my desire is to create art that is timeless and of substance.

WHAT CHALLENGES HAVE YOU ENCOUNTERED IN YOUR CAREER?

There aren't enough roles for black actors. I find it bizarre that as an African Canadian living and working in Canada I have never been cast as an African Canadian

HOW DID YOU OVERCOME?

I have and continue to overcome my obstacles by producing, collaborating and networking. When I moved to Toronto I met a group of actors who were also frustrated by the lack of black theatre in Toronto and we formed the Obsidian Theatre Company. Today it is a place where black actors, train, work and gain mentorship.

WHO DO YOU RESPECT THE MOST IN THE INDUSTRY AND WHY?

Trey Anthony. Her ongoing success with *Da Kink*, from a fringe festival play to TV series is amazing and inspiring. Trey Anthony is a fellow trailblazer who inspires me.

ANY WORDS OF WISDOM FOR THOSE WHO WILL FOLLOW IN YOUR FOOTSTEPS?

Believe in yourself and MAKE it happen.



RICHIE MRINAL MEHTA

"I got to know most of my core team at the 2003 ReelWorld Film Festival. The environment was so electric, and after the festival we were so energized that we collaborated on several projects here and in India."

WHAT ARE YOU CURRENTLY WORKING ON?

Two feature films and a short.

WHAT IS YOUR RAISON D'ÊTRE?

Exploration. As long as I never completely reach where I'm going, I'll be motivated to attempt to reach that point. And with each project, I learn more about myself, both in conception and execution.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

I simply follow my instincts, which tell me to initiate projects based on ideas and experiences I have.

HOW DO YOU ENVISION YOUR ROLE IN THE FUTURE OF CANADA'S FILM/TV INDUSTRY?

Making movies I want to see, and movies that can challenge audiences.

WHO DO YOU RESPECT THE MOST IN THE INDUSTRY AND WHY?

I respect filmmakers who are in a position to do what they want, who have access to great resources and choose to do projects they believe in, even though they are risky.

It's so easy to lose your way in this field – to do it for the wrong reasons. And if you're lucky enough to sustain yourself in this work, and you stay true to yourself – and don't get distracted by others – you've succeeded on your own terms.

ANY WORDS OF WISDOM FOR THOSE WHO WILL FOLLOW IN YOUR FOOTSTEPS?

In terms of directing, know why you want to do this work before you get too involved in it. Otherwise, you'll end up working to support other people's dreams, and it's too tedious an industry to settle. You need to learn the craft, watch films and study what's come before you.

I'm choreographing the Aboriginal Achievement Awards, which airs on Global in April.

WHAT PAST PROJECT ARE YOU MOST PROUD OF?

My role in Four Sheets to the Wind, which won me the Special Jury Prize for Acting at Sundance.

WHAT IS YOUR RAISON D'ÊTRE? Finding truth beneath all the BS.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

I feel like I make the most difference as a dance teacher and Native youth arts facilitator.

HOW DO YOU ENVISION YOUR ROLE IN THE FUTURE OF CANADA'S FILM/TV INDUSTRY?

I want to continue making meaningful work and I want to help create an industry that not only welcomes diversity, but also supports it.

WHAT CHALLENGES HAVE YOU **ENCOUNTERED IN YOUR CAREER?**

Typecasting. It's been hard to be seen as something other than an ethnic-specific role.

HOW DID YOU OVERCOME?

Working as much as possible in every discipline and proving that I'm more than a convenient casting necessity.

WHO DO YOU RESPECT THE MOST IN THE INDUSTRY AND WHY?

My sister, Jennifer Podemski, because of her commitment to the craft, to her community and to her own dreams.

ANY WORDS OF WISDOM FOR THOSE WHO WILL FOLLOW IN YOUR FOOTSTEPS?

Every kick along the way, every roadblock, every disappointment – turn it around in your head and shape it as an empowering experience that only drives you farther. Honour those moments (as discouraging as they may be), as gifts of strength. Otherwise, the negativity will eat you alive.

"If you keep knocking on doors, one eventually opens."

WHAT PAST PROJECT ARE YOU MOST PROUD OF?

The project I am most proud of is my National Film Board documentary *Breakin' In: The Making of a Hip Hop Dancer.* It was a year-long study of the lives and ambitions of female dancers in the music video industry. The documentary aired on CBC and on Discovery Times in the United States,

and screened at film festivals around the world.

WHAT IS YOUR RAISON D'ÊTRE?

My desire to meet interesting people and tell their stories. I like to profile people who don't have an opportunity to be heard.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

In my role as the medical producer for CTV, I produce health stories to educate viewers about complex medical advances. I highlight emerging health concerns and controversies so people can make informed choices about their health. I also share patients' inspirational stories.

In my role as a filmmaker, I screen my NFB documentary for young girls and I lead discussion groups on issues such as body image and gender in an attempt to spark dialogue. The documentary is also screened in high school media classes as a teaching tool.

HOW DO YOU ENVISION YOUR ROLE IN THE FUTURE OF CANADA'S FILM/TV INDUSTRY?

I see myself as a director and producer of provocative social issues and popular culture documentaries that will move and inspire audiences nationally and worldwide.

WHO DO YOU RESPECT THE MOST IN THE INDUSTRY AND WHY?

My colleague and friend, reporter Avis Favaro. She has a great deal of integrity. She approaches everything she does with enthusiasm and a positive outlook and she is motivated by a strong desire to help people.

ANY WORDS OF WISDOM FOR THOSE WHO WILL FOLLOW IN YOUR FOOTSTEPS?

Work very hard, always believe in yourself. Keep trying and never give up.



MILLIE TOM

OCCUPATION: CASTING DIRECTOR

BORN: BRAMPTON LIVES: TORONTO

"I met a young earnest-looking director when I sat on a panel at ReelWorld Film Festival. Afterwards, he asked if I would help him with his student film, which I did. He just returned from India having wrapped his first feature, a film that I was lucky enough to consult on."

WHAT PAST PROJECT ARE YOU MOST PROUD OF?

I have always been a big fan of the actress Maggie Cheung and French director Olivier Assayas. When I heard they were coming to town to work on the film *Clean*, I was given the task of finding Maggie's son in the film, a half Asian/half-Caucasian child. Olivier wanted a real child, rather than a professional child actor. After three open calls and many schools later, we found the boy and it was a remarkable feeling of accomplishment.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

I hope I can help producers and directors think creatively and realistically when it comes to diversity casting. There is always a need to find actors from various ethnic backgrounds and it takes the efforts of casting directors to seek them out.

WHO DO YOU RESPECT THE MOST IN THE INDUSTRY AND WHY?

I have two mentors. Deirdre Bowen was my first boss and not only was she patient during my formative years in casting, but she was an incredible teacher and continues to be an incredible mentor. My second mentor,

Robin Cook, has provided me with the opportunity to work with her on some truly wonderful projects, and to meet some of the most talented and exciting filmmakers in the industry.

ANY WORDS OF WISDOM FOR THOSE WHO WILL FOLLOW IN YOUR FOOTSTEPS?


