ABOUT BFC


The Burundi Film Center (burundifilmcenter.org) is a media development project launched by three Canadian filmmakers in the little-known East African nation of Burundi. With no outside funding, their own equipment and some resourceful friends, the Canadians (two from Ottawa, one from Montreal) were able to train 36 students, aged 18 to 25, the basics of film production and produce five short dramatic films. Already wooing audiences around East Africa, the films now come to Toronto for the first time.

SPINNING INTO BUTTER

MARK BROKAW

Based on Rebecca Gilman's acclaimed Broadway play, *Spinning Into Butter* is a fascinating look at the psychoses surrounding race in America. Set at a small Arts College in Vermont, the story begins when someone leaves racist notes on the dorm-room door of an African-American student.

Not wanting to appear insensitive, the college immediately calls a campus-wide meeting to discuss the situation. What results is a gripping tale that pushes all the unspoken hot buttons of racism in today's society.

As the hate crimes and media attention intensify, the school's student dean (Sarah Jessica Parker) is placed in a position where she must examine her own feelings about race and prejudice, while maintaining her administration's politically correct policies.

Spinning Into Butter depicts honestly how far behind the mainstream is in coming to grips with the reality of racism and multiculturalism.



Mark Brokaw is an accomplished stage director and choreographer. Over the years, he has received many accolades for his work including a directing fellowship from the Drama League of New York. Desperate, Mario looks for any means possible to gain an entry visa, and decides his only option is to plan a robbery. But what is Mario really looking for? Is it the American dream? Or is it peace? Then he meets Blanca (Kate Del Castillo), a nightclub dancer. She opens the door to a life full of dreams, and invites him to join her on a new journey: the Bolivian dream.

Buffy Sainte-Marie: A Multimedia Life is beautiful documentary about peace activist and songwriter Buffy Sainte-Marie. 



The two small-time crooks, shaped as comic book characters, react funnily and unpredictably in weird situations and circumstances in a city that pulsates around the clock. With humour and lightness, the plot brims over with incredible coincidences and chaotic moments. The dynamic and visually appealing photography supports the loosely structured dramaturgy.

New for Indian cinema, Kalpesh Patel's unconventionally structured film brings freshness by its style and charm. Although it's nothing like most Indian popular cinema – Patel takes pride in having grown up with Bollywood dreams that are "bigger than life," as he puts it. His film is fun to watch and invites contemplation. It screened at Rotterdam earlier this year.



After serving a jail sentence, Manyisa is offered a second chance at life when he's taken in by a pastor and his family. Pastor Jacob, whose brother died due to gang violence, sees his late brother in Manyisa. And a tender bond forms between Manyisa and Jacob's young son. Very quickly Manyisa is drawn into assisting with the church choir, and soon finds himself accepted by the congregation. But this chance at a new life is threatened when Manyisa's former crime boss has other ideas. Then a robbery occurs at Manyisa's work where a foreman is killed and Manyisa disappears. All of a sudden, it's no longer about redeeming himself in the eyes of others, it's about giving himself a second chance.



Angus Gibson began his filmmaking career in the 80s. He later formed Free Film-Makers, an organization that encouraged the creation of films that reflect the South African reality. 

Those familiar with Melvin Van Peebles know him as the driving force behind the 1971 film *Sweet Sweetback's Baadasssss Song*, which grossed more than \$10 million, making it the most successful independent film of its time.

This documentary about his life is full of rare archival footage, including interviews and unforgettable stories from Spike Lee, Mario Van Peebles, Gil Scott-Heron and St. Clair Bourne. Naturally, by insisting on doing things his way, Van Peebles stepped on some toes, yet he refused to back down. "My politics is to win," he declared. This maverick, modern-day Renaissance man whether making guerrilla-style films, flying Air Force sorties over the Pacific, studying astronomy in Amsterdam, writing novels in self-taught French, composing music, writing stage plays, recording albums or trading options on Wall Street, has blazed his own path, making a mark in each endeavour he's pursued.

Humorous, serious and incisive, this film is a story about the power of fearlessness. It received the Lancia Award and Audience Award at the Biografilm Festival in 2006.



Joe Angio is an award-winning filmmaker and magazine editor. Jay fails miserably with the "sistahs." At last he meets the dynamic Catherine (Lia Johnson), a misunderstood "Half-rican Canadian," who's as righteously quirky as he is. To win her heart, Jay must confront his fears as he realizes commitment is a bigger issue than race. I'm Through With White Girls, written by Courtney Lilly (Arrested Development, Everybody Hates Chris, My Boys), is a quirky romantic comedy addressing race, class and cultural identity in America that is fresh, funny and fabulous.



Jennifer Sharp graduated from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. James Brewster "Jamesie" is an uncompromising musician from the Caribbean island of St. Croix who's dedicated to preserving scratch music. The 79-year-old is known for his humorous, provocative and playful compositions, and lively performances. Scratch music is an indigenous, grassroots form of folk music that originated over a century ago in the U.S. Virgin Islands. Today, it's the official music of the Virgin Islands. The lyrics are a form of oral history used to immortalize historical events, spread gossip about one's neighbours and relay the day-to-day trials and tribulations of living on a small island.

Jamesie, King of Scratch brilliantly injects harmony into the soul. It's a magnificent tribute to the legacy of the descendants of the slave trade in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The film played in festivals in the Bahamas, Miami, Park City and Germany, and won a gold medal for best documentary on a musical subject and the People's Choice Award at the Bay Street Film Festival.



Khaneh Ma examines questions of cultural identity by presenting three generations of Iranians, divided on three continents and reunited on one journey. This intimate portrait of diaspora begins with the director's return to Iran, her country of cultural origin, where she reacquaints herself with family she has not seen in over 10 years – and rediscovers a culture that has remained a quiet yet ever-present part of her life in Canada. As the journey unfolds, we uncover rarely seen aspects of Iranian culture, as experienced by the director, while witnessing first-hand the process of leaving an old culture behind and the journey into a new one. The film is full of memorable images, like a memorial procession of self-flagellating men, and sweetly candid moments, like a grandpa hand-crushing dried herbs at the dinner table for his daughter to bring home.

NAMIBIA: THE STRUGGLE FOR LIBERATION

CHARLES BURNETT

Namibia: The Struggle for Liberation is an award-winning fictional tale about the real-life rise to power of Samuel Nujoma, a prominent leader in Namibia's struggle for independence and the country's first president. It opens with a young Nujoma learning that he's a direct descendant of royalty. But with his country under constant oppression from South Africa, he goes to live with an aunt for safety reasons. While there, he befriends a religious man (Danny Glover) who has a profound impact on his life. Later he forms the SWAPO political movement that, with the assistance of some foreign governments, eventually earns Namibia its independence.

This epic and visually compelling film examines the Namibian people's long struggle for independence with grace and brutal honesty. Rather than a documentary-style history of the brutal conflict, the film mixes real and composite characters to explore the spirit and sacrifices of the struggle that culminated in independence in 1990. Covering over 60 years of history, *Namibia* details the events, people and places that shaped Nujoma's political consciousness.



Considered one of America's greatest filmmakers, Charles Burnett studied film at UCLA. His first feature, *Killer of Sheep*, won a prize at Berlin in the 80s. Other credits include *The Glass Shield*, *The Wedding*, *The Annihilation of Fish*, *Olivia's Story* and countless TV productions. He has also worked as a writer, producer and cinematographer.

Award-winning Senegalese filmmaker Moussa Touré takes us to the Catalan village of Saint Feliu where immigrants from Mali have changed the cultural makeup of the village. The film portrays the reality between Mali and Catalonia, two communities struggling to share the same city and yet ignoring each other's existence. Moussa Touré deeply explores the underlying social issues between those two communities, following their stories, their fears, and shows how pride and ignorance can affect human relationships.

When a number of African men wash up on a beach populated by sunbathing Catalans, the Catalans quickly grab their beach towels and wrap them around the shivering men. Touré perfectly captures the humanity of a simple gesture of kindness.

Nosaltres is a documentary that everyone should see with a lesson that no one should forget!



Moussa Touré began his film career in 1987 with the short film *Baram*. He also worked as an assistant on films such as François Truffaut's *Adèle H*. and Bertrand Tavernier's *Coup de Torchon*. His first feature, *Toubab Bi*, won several prizes and awards. His other film, *TGV*, won the Public Prize at the Milan African Film Festival.

Told over the span of three days, *The Limits* unites four seemingly disparate stories at a seedy motel near one of Toronto's roughest neighbourhoods. Kelly, a social outcast resolves to fulfill his every fantasy a week before ending his life. Tyrel, a troubled youth on the run from an inner city gang finds work with the motel's East Indian proprietors, Sanjeet and Satia. Alan, a suburban family man begins an illicit affair, and Mel, an ex-prostitute who's found God is haunted by her past when her old pimp is released from prison.

These marginalized characters are all running from their past, all of them finding temporary refuge at the Maple Leaf Motel. Their intimate stories expose us to lives less ordinary, and reveal in all of us the pressures of coping when pushed to the limits.

The colliding stories first present us with social and ethnic stereotypes and then challenge conventional assumptions about class and racial identity.

The Limits invites the viewer to take a closer, more insightful look at the lives of these misfits, and asks what would you do in their place?

Jamie Meltzer has created a fascinating look into this newly emerging film culture, exploring its peculiar inner workings, economic challenges, and diverse array of colourful films. Travelling to the country's chaotic capitol, Lagos, Meltzer spent 10 weeks following three of Nigeria's hottest directors, each different in personality and style, as they shot films about love, betrayal, war and the supernatural.

In Nigeria, you're not a real filmmaker until, like Chico Ejiro (aka "Mr. Prolific") you've made so many films that you don't remember the plotlines. This is a lesson in guerilla filmmaking, Nigerian style. Welcome to Nollywood.

This is made possible through the generous support of his wife, author/screenwriter/producer Lynne Stoltz, now a ReelWorld Film Festival board member, and daughter Sasha Stoltz. The award is a fitting dedication to a man who displayed expert knowledge of and passion for two things – business and Canadian film.


Tony was a savvy businessman – two qualities that serve emerging filmmakers well in today's competitive film industry. At the time he and Lynne launched their production company, Have Faith Productions, Tony was already at the helm of three successful companies: Sound Waves, Tomax Corporation and Tomax Credit Corporation.

Tony's first project produced under Have Faith Productions, *Loud Silence*, garnered attention from three of North America's most talented and revered artists – Mykelti Williamson, Alfre Woodard and Dr. Maya Angelou. The film was adapted from the novel written by his "forever soul mate" Lynne. He handled it all, with standards and integrity, never losing sight of what mattered most to him, his family and his friends.

Tony believed in the Canadian film industry and had great expectations of it. He joined the ReelWorld Foundation board to help bring its vision to life. Gone too soon? Yes, but not forgotten. It is in this spirit that ReelWorld is honoured, along with his family, to reward a unique talent with the Tony Stoltz ReelWorld Visionary Award. The award applauds an individual who is not afraid to pioneer and create opportunities for others, to open closed doors to make change happen. Tony was such an individual. Basically, I'm part of a team that finds and develops the network's programming.

On a professional level, I want to do good TV. Since childhood, I've wanted to be part of the fabrication, to be behind the scenes and help achieve the talents' vision for the small screen, which for me is anything but small!

BIGGEST CHALLENGE

Breaking in was tough. My only solution was to learn my craft as best I could – through schooling, mentors, attending readings, and with hands-on experience – and then, when the time came, to have the humility to be a small part of a bigger thing. TV is not a one man show.

ADVICE FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

In this industry, only a few succeed, and it's rare that anything is handed to you. It takes hard work to make it in the long run. So my advice, on a personal level, is to believe in yourself, and professionally, to apply yourself!

ON PAYING DUES

I've been overlooked many times in my life. As an actor, there are lots of roles I wasn't cast in that I felt I should have got. But I try to keep moving forward.

PROUDEST ACHIEVEMENTS

I'm proud of the movie *Doomstown*. The story takes place in the projects in Toronto, and my character is caught in the drug game and tries to get out, which puts his family in danger. It was the first opportunity I got to carry a movie, and that was huge for me. In the film *Poor Boy's Game*, I only had a week to prepare to play a mentally challenged kid, which was tough. I did lots of research, and I'm proud of how it turned out.

AN ACTOR PREPARES

Before an audition, I'll read the material, then step away. Then I read it again and break down what the story is about. Sometimes it's hard because you only get the sides [the scene that's used in the audition], and not the whole script, so you have to imagine a back story.

WHAT'S NEXT

Unless you've signed the dotted line, you don't really want to talk, because things do fall through, and you could look like an idiot! That said, I'm writing three feature films right now, and I have a few acting projects that should come through this year. We'll see!

On a typical day, I drop my daughter at school on my way to a set or rehearsal, then make calls on behalf of ACTRA. When I'm working, I give it my full attention. At lunch, I review grant applications and reports, and at the end of the day, I scoop up my daughter and get home in time to read books and play some board games together.

STANDING UP

When choosing to speak up, we risk being called "difficult." I've been asked to translate and speak languages that I do not speak; and teach others to Throat sing, although I'm not Inuit and don't know how. I will not fake it, and I've been chastised for remaining firm. But when it comes to cultural specificity – especially from an Aboriginal perspective – I won't back down.

ABOUT CANADA

An Elder once told me that you cannot grow a tree if you do not feed its roots. I wish that Canadians had a better understanding of this country's history from an Aboriginal perspective. If Canada continues to mistreat its indigenous people, we cannot be a healthy country with many branches. If we can remain connected to nature, and believe in the importance of community and peace, then we will become world leaders.

JOB, IN A NUTSHELL

The DCG is a national labour organization representing thousands of Canadians who work in the areas of direction, design, production and editing. We lobby for government policy that supports content, funding and regulation, we negotiate labour agreements, and administer important services for our members, like health benefits and pension plans. Specifically, my job is to bring attention to various issues affecting our membership and our industry. I'm lucky to work with a team I admire, in service to people I genuinely care about.

ON THE CANADIAN INDUSTRY

Canada has world-class talent creating shows that are internationally renowned. We have a national inferiority complex. People will say "Oh, that looks Canadian." But so many big U.S. films are shot here, with Canadian crews and talent. It's the same people, the same quality of work. The only difference is budget: one episode of a U.S. drama can be four million; in Canada it's \$400,000. We're dealing in very different dollars, but Canadians still manage to deliver quality.

BEST ADVICE

Canadian film and television is only getting better – so consume it! Watch Canadian TV, attend Canadian films on opening weekend and go to festivals. I think every group on earth has a film festival in this country, it's amazing.



AUSTIN WONG

JOB, IN A NUTSHELL

I convince people to let our company make movies. I secure financing and rights, hire writers, actors and directors, and negotiate deals with distributors and broadcasters. My goal is to contribute to the creation of ground-breaking films.

CHALLENGE SURMOUNTED

When I graduated from law school and despite skepticism from my friends, I turned down the lawyer jobs and took an entry-level position at Alliance to get film industry experience. A year later, I was offered a lawyer job at another company, which launched my career.

FAMILY MATTERS

My family has always been supportive, even way back when I was closing deals for *Girls Gone Wild*. Now that I'm working with Oscar-nominated directors and Nobel Prize-winning authors, they can be openly proud.

LIKES & DISLIKES ABOUT CANADA

I wish Canadians would embrace homegrown talent more readily. I like that we have an unfussy attitude toward multiculturalism.

ADVICE FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

Don't have too much attitude about jobs that you perceive as below you. I know many people, myself included, who willingly started in lowly positions, but learned a lot and moved up quickly. Also, be polite and friendly to everyone you meet. You never know who's connected to who, and relationships are everything.

PROUDEST ACHIEVEMENT

I'm proud that I still have the ability to try. It's really easy to feel a sense of entitlement, like I deserve this, so I hope I'm always hungry, because that ability to try is everything. When I was 14, my dad once called me lazy. I really respect his work ethic, so I swore he was never going to be able to say that again. We joke about it now – he's tried to take it back!
